The Australian Horse Archery Association is a not for profit association that was founded by Katrina Kruse in 2013. The AHAA promotes the sport of Horse Archery throughout Australia and is affiliated with the International Horse Archery Alliance and recognised worldwide as our National body for Australia. AHAA currently has several Branches throughout Australia, all governed by the AHAA, its code of conduct, and its Management Committee.

A Branch affiliated with AHAA is made up of persons who are already individual financial members of AHAA. Affiliation with AHAA allows the use of the name AHAA in all media and advertising. You would adopt a geographical branch name for example:

Australian Horse Archery Association - Perth Branch,

Australian Horse Archery Association - South Gippland Branch.

This would immediately show your affiliation with the governing Australian body.

An annual fee of \$50 will be paid by each Branch.

Each Branch will have access to all associated paperwork already prepared to help you set up your Branch successfully. As a Branch Manager your State representative will represent you on the AHAA Committee and be your first contact for support.

In order to comply with AHAA requirements and AHAA insurance all participants and helpers at rallies, displays and competitions MUST be current AHAA members, Riding or Associate or Ground Crew.

The email you provide will be used to grant you access to the branch manager folder in google drive with forms and information you will need, including the list of current AHAA members.

It is very important that Branch Managers are aware of and follow the AHAA bylaws and procedures.

We look forward to welcoming new branches and furthering the sport of horse archery in Australia.
